Dates 2 CHANGES TO AUTHORISED ABSENCES FOR HOLIDAYS TAKEN DURING TERM TIME 2 Labelling Parents have a legal duty to make sure their child aged 5-16 attends school regularly. Currently we may, in special circumstances, grant leave of absence of up to ten days for the purpose of a family holiday during term time. The application is made in advance and the head teacher must be satisfied that there are special circumstances which warrant the leave. This is granted on the head teacher's discretion and is not a parental Looking Back/ 2 Looking Ahead right. Following advice from the LA and the DfE 'Advice on School Attendance' document, the Governors have agreed that from September 2014 penalty notices may be issued to parents where a pupil's absence has not been authorised by the school. Penalty notices can be issued to each parent liable for the attendance offence or offences. Penalty notices are fines of f60/f120 imposed on parents. They can only be issued by a head teacher or someone authorised by them. There is no right to appeal by parents against a penalty notice. We will, however consider 'exceptional' circumstances before issuing Penalty Notice or commencing prosecution. These four points will be (as per guidance from NCC Attendance and Targeted Support): The likelihood that particular circumstances would recur That the circumstances mean that the holiday would significantly improve a child's health or wellbeing That the circumstances mean that the holiday would prevent a deterioration of a child's health or wellbeing That the circumstances mean that the child's educational development is unlikely to be impaired. Attendance in school is a statutory requirement from the age of 5. The school doors open at 8.45 am and registration is between 8.50 and 9.00 am. Arrival after 9.00 am is classed as late and is recorded as such on pupils' attendance records. It is important for children to arrive at school punctually every day, unless they are unwell. The school day ends at 3.15 pm for all pupils. The school is required to track all pupils' attendance which will be investigated if it is below 80% when I will contact you. If you have any problems with your child attending school, it is important to discuss this with myself at the earliest point. Equally, if your arrangements for collecting your child alter, it is important that the class teacher is made aware.

# LOOKING AHEAD

One of the real strengths of our school is the range of clubs offered to the children. From French to '*Mad Science*' to the range of Sports related activities we offer, there really is something for everyone. Next term promises to be even better with more new clubs, including a '*Lego*' club for our reception children, a cooking club (led by our PGCE Students) and an Art club for our year I children. Next term we will be focussing on preparing all our children for transition towards their next phase in education, whether it be to Bispham Juniors, into year 2 from year 1, from reception into KS1 or from our nursery into reception.

Our year 2 children will be carrying out their SATs assessments (we make this an enjoyable experience and the children love the idea of 'special' work!). These take place over the first 3/4 weeks after the holiday. You can help your child by making sure they have plenty of sleep, a hearty breakfast and arrive to school on time every day! Thank you! In year 1, children's phonics skills will be assessed through the national statutory Phonics Screening. These assessments take place mid June.
